

Mission Statement

"Club Coaching Structure

"An effective club coaching structure is the arrangement of competent and knowledgeable club personnel in such a way that quality coaching can be delivered to develop and progress players.

The structure should be sustainable and involve a coaching committee, coaching officer and coaches working towards an agreed long term coaching plan, whilst delivering set targets and objectives at each age level."

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"Club Coaching Structure

"An <u>effective</u> club <u>coaching structure</u> is the <u>arrangement</u> of <u>competent</u> and <u>knowledgeable club personnel</u> in such a way that <u>quality coaching</u> can be <u>delivered</u> to <u>develop</u> and <u>progress</u> players.

The <u>structure</u> should be <u>sustainable</u> and involve a <u>coaching</u> committee, <u>coaching officer</u> and <u>coaches working</u> towards an <u>agreed long term coaching plan</u>, whilst <u>delivering</u> set <u>targets</u> and <u>objectives</u> at each <u>age level</u>."







Club Coaching Officer

- Oversees the entire coaching and games programme
- Responsible for
 - Establishing coaching committee and chair meetings
 - Appointment of club coaches
 - Coach education
 - Management of coaching resources
 - Devise and implement club coaching plan
 - Club School Links
- Should be good leader, good communicator, delegator, mentor, organiser

Club Coaching Administrator / Youth Officer

- Coordinates and administers coaching committee meetings
- Regular coaching report for executive committee
- Assist club secretary with underage fixtures
- Coordinate pitch / facility usage
- Assist club registrar to provide lists of players for head coaches
- Assist club PRO in promoting events and games and match reports

Children's Officer

- Ensure that the child protection procedures are understood and adhered to by all members.
- Promote Best Practice guidelines for people working with children
- Attend the GAA workshop 'Good Practice & Child Protection' renewable every three years – ensure coaches and anyone working with children attends this
- Coordinate Access NI / Garda Vetting for all coaches and people who work with children in club environment
- Understand the GAA Code of Ethics, child protection procedures, rules and regulations.
- Acknowledge and deal with complaints ensure that the complaints procedures are followed through to the final decision.
- Attend meetings of the County Youth Board as appropriate
- Attending meetings of club coaching committee as appropriate

Club School Liaison Officer

- Provides direct link between club and school
- In contact with principal, PE coordinator and Gaelic Games coordinator in school
- Agreed plan of after school coaching if required
- Communicates with club coaches
- Coordinates equipment and kit if necessary
- Arranges facility sharing

Equipment Coordinator

- Audit of all coaching equipment in club
- Storage of equipment that coaches can access
- Communicate with head coaches to monitor equipment
- Responsibility for ordering equipment as approved by coaching committee and club executive

Head Coach

- Chief organiser for that particular age group of players
 - Games, coaching, transport
- Communicate effectively with players and parents
- Knowledge of Long Term Player Pathway and age appropriate coaching
- Delegate responsibility to assistant coaches
- Represent age group at coaching committee meetings
- Attend coach education opportunities




Assistant Coach


- Input into coaching programme
- Actively Coaching not just standing watching
- Monitor player attendance and performance
- Transport, Jerseys, Water, Pitch Set Up, Umpiring, side line duties
- Constantly learning and acquiring knowledge and experience – coaching course, expertise within club

Parent Helper

- To provide supervisory assistance at coaching sessions
- Assist Head coach with administrative duties
- Assist with skills testing and recording of results
- Supply or organise transport
- Umpiring or side line duties at youth games
- Aspiration to attain coaching awards and involved more with coaching

Case Study – A "Superclub"

Ballyboden St Enda's, Dublin

- Director of Coaching and a Games Promotion Officer employed
- Arrangement between Dublin county board and club
- They run a wide range of initiatives to help develop the club, involving schools coaching, coach education and development of coaches
- Field 70 teams across all codes 4 minor football teams!!
- 1000 children attend the Cul Camp each year (2nd biggest in Ireland)

- One of their main areas now is engaging with youth
 - Get them involved in coaching while they are still playing
 - Links with Secondary schools, Club Camps, Club Nursery
 - Experience of coaching is good for their CVs
- Club places huge emphasis on <u>coach education</u> yearly Foundation award hosted by the club
- Forbairt Programme

15 coaches selected - club coach development group — club supports and develops these young people as coaches

Future Hopes

Base of young coaches, long term juvenile and adult coaches
Future club leaders and administrators
Continuation of a strong club identity
